International Leadership Program for Microfinance Supervisors

June 16 – 20, 2025 Toronto, Canada, EDT







PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This five-half-day virtual program is aimed at enhancing the capacity of supervisors to oversee the microfinance sector more effectively, while promoting change that supports availability, access and use of a full range of financial services and a sustainable and inclusive economy.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

This Toronto Centre (TC) program is designed in such a way as to reflect the current context globally and to support aligning supervisory frameworks with developmental landscapes:

- Supervising microfinance institutions (MFIs), village savings and loan associations, and other microfinancing activities
- Understanding Microfinance and its implication for financial stability
- Preventing misconduct and abusive practices: improving transparency, disclosure, and financial consumer protection
- Development roles for financial institutions, financial regulators and supervisors, nongovernmental organizations, government, etc.
- Microfinance as a bridge for financial inclusion, financial literacy and food security
- Technology, a microfinance challenge and opportunity.

METHODOLOGY

TC is at the forefront of new and emerging issues relevant to financial services. TC uses a highly interactive teaching approach, using case studies, presentations and exercises. Participants will work in groups on activities about issues raised in a case study-based on real-life experiences and session material. Through this workshop, Toronto Centre raises awareness to identify key barriers to scaling up microfinance from a regulatory and supervisory perspective.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

This program is aimed at senior and mid-level professionals from central banks, microfinance regulators and supervisors, and their reporting ministries from developing countries. Others from government agencies responsible for aspects of microfinance, the finance ecosystem, the economy or development and cooperation may also find the information of value. Participants should have at least three years of working experience in regulation, supervision, analytical or policy experience in the microfinance, and be proficient in English.
